Dear Friends,

This year, I'm going to try to grow some tomatoes. I did it once back in Scotland with some interesting results. I reckon if I give it a try over here, the climate should make things ideal. Back in old Caledonia, the frost and the freezing rain usually killed most of my plants. But this year will be different. This year I'll follow the instructions.

I guess you'll find me at Wal-Mart, over the next couple of weeks, pensively looking over tomato seed packets. I'll be checking for quality, flavor and quantity. No doubt, I'll be wearing my glasses to make me look like I know what I'm doing. Eventually, I will walk out with plenty of packets and a pocketful of prayers.

You see, despite my enthusiasm, I don't have any green thumbs. As soon as my family read this newsletter, their eyes will roll and each one of them will sigh. "Dad's off on one of his obsessions again" will be the comment. Soon, the window pane above the kitchen sink will be full of little polystyrene cups, filled with potting soil and laden with so many seeds that they will just burst into prominence after a couple of weeks. At least that's the theory.

The reality will be quite different. In my enthusiasms, I will probably over water them to begin with. Then, when I see that the soil is thoroughly soaked, I'll tip the cups over to get rid of some of the water. This will quickly follow up with a dry period, which will cause most of the tiny seeds to dehydrate, and before I know it, quite a number of little plants will be lost.

Then I'll become a plant paramedic and will use all sorts of treatments, nutrients and other young plant aids. By this time, my family will be feeling neglected and that all of my focus, attention and even affection will be given to the struggling seedlings. By spring, I'll have one or two plants in pots and be ready to transfer

them outside. As usual, I'll leave Mother Nature to do the rest, which means that I'll be lucky to get 3 or 4 tomatoes off each plant. And whether they are yellow, green, orange, red or purple, I'll pick them off, put them in a sandwich and declare to my unbelieving family that those were the best tomatoes I have ever tasted!

I'm a terrible gardener. I don't grow plants well. However, I'm trained to grow souls and I have a better success rate in helping people to enhance their spiritual lives. In the last nine years, I have watched some of you grow spiritually and I have been thrilled with some of the results.

Young parents bring their children to church, giving their families the opportunity to grow up in God's love. Children participate in our music programs, drawing them closer together and ministering to many churches. Young people, whose zeal for justice and the Lord, causes them to take leadership roles in the congregation and across the denomination. Young couples too, who want to strengthen their partnerships, taking time to come to church, to worship and pray together, to blossom and stay together.

Adults, who yearn for the truth and guidance in a world of confusion, taking time to study God's word and share their faith journeys. And Seniors, preparing themselves patiently for that day when they will encounter Christ face to face, still showing love, devotion and commitment that inspires every generation of the congregation.

As we grow at Erin, we are becoming stronger in faith and more committed to Christ's ministry amongst us, as well as around us. He's creating a beautiful garden with us, so let us be truly thankful for the showers of blessing, refreshment, renewal and growth that God has given to all of our souls.

May God grant you the desire of your hearts and may all your plans succeed.

**MISSION NEWS**

Over the past year the Mission & Evangelism team has changed our involvement with hunger relief and we'd like to update the congregation on this. For many years we'd worked with Farragut Presbyterian on food collection, purchasing and sorting for FISH of Knox County. FISH has been active in Knoxville for over 30 years and provides and delivers 3-day emergency food supplies to those in need. Changing government regulations on purchasing of deeply-discounted USDA food, and restrictions on eligibility of recipients, made it difficult to meet our commitment to this ministry. As well, our role was strictly "behind the scenes" and we wanted to look for hands-on ways of helping with hunger relief. We've since parted with Farragut Presbyterian and have developed a new partnership with Middlebrook United Methodist Church (MUMC), in making food deliveries to families in need. This is still through FISH of Knox County, but because MUMC doesn't use USDA food, they don't have to comply with the new regulations. This is important; because Jesus calls us to feed the hungry, not enforce eligibility requirements.

Our initial experience with MUMC has been gratifying and a lot of fun. MUMC handles FISH food requests on the 4<sup>th</sup> Friday of every month, which this year included both the day after Thanksgiving and the day after Christmas. Each of these days, teams of volunteers from MUMC and Erin made about 80 food deliveries, mostly in the afternoon, with each team typically making 2-4 deliveries. I brought along several of my children (Peter and David McKay) and let them learn for themselves the joy and responsibility of mission. If you'd like to help with FISH food deliveries, or with other hunger relief activities such as Hunger Hike, Mobile Meals or Second Harvest, please contact Larry McKay, 691-5341, or Patty Pierce, 691-1744, or better yet, come out to an M&E team meeting (1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday of each month at 7 PM in the Parlor).
