
Summer Book Discussion

Anna McKay, Pat Wallin, and Kim Jaynes recently read *Being Mortal* by Atul Gawande, a medical writer, surgeon, and public health researcher. Based on stories about Dr. Gawande's own patients and family members, the book explores how modern medicine—having made great strides in treating diseases and extending life spans—is perhaps less successful in handling the inevitable reality of aging and death. He explores how procedures set up by nursing homes and assisted living facilities for the efficiency of their staff may ignore choices that would greatly improve the quality of residents' lives, and why doctors are reluctant to talk honestly with patients and their families when hopes of a cure are slim. Through his research, Dr. Gawande presents examples of how we can do better by engaging in hard conversations and trying to preserve what people value most.

This book raises important issues and will help you feel more comfortable, and even more hopeful, when you inevitably face these challenges. You still have time to read the book and join our discussion on Sunday morning, July 17 at 9:45 in the new Sunday school wing. We'll provide coffee and goodies!


A Message From The Pastor

Exodus 13:21 By day the Lord went ahead of them in a pillar of cloud to guide them on their way and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night.

Dear Friends,

I have just finished reading and reviewing a book called "Lessons from the East," by Bob Roberts Jr, who is the founding pastor of Northwood Church in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. In recent years, Bob has focused his ministry on helping and developing church leaders across the world, but mostly in the Eastern hemisphere. His work has brought him into regular contact with pastors in Australia, Pakistan, Syria, Egypt, Vietnam, Nigeria, and Nepal.



What if our Western view of Church isn't God's view of Church?

Some of the Christian pastors that Bob encountered work in areas where Christianity is largely outnumbered by Islamic or Buddhist communities. The churches in those areas have to find ways of building up relationships with the major religious groups and leaders in their region. In order to survive, they need to amicably work and share resources together. Rather than confronting and condemning other groups, they celebrate religious diversity and respect other traditions. They do this without diminishing their faith in Christ. They look for areas of commonality and community; they support one another in times of trouble and distress. In other words, they look for God in their midst and seek to be led by the Spirit to share Christ's love and peace with those around them.

As Erin heads into a new fiscal year and another season of church world, we need to be looking for new ways to live our faith in our community. In the ancient past, God led His people by a pillar of smoke or fire each day and night, showing them the way ahead and guiding them toward the Promised Land. These days, God calls on us to seek Him not just in our sanctuary, but in the streets, homes, schools, and businesses of our community. In other words, we are faced with a similar question, just like the one that Bob Roberts posed in his book:

What if our particular view of Erin Church isn't God's view of Erin Church?

May God continue to lead us onward and upward in our journey of faith as we serve His Son Jesus Christ in our church, community, and world. God bless us all.

KARM - CORNERS OF YOUR FIELD

This is an Organization that Erin Outreach Team works with and we wanted to make the congregation aware of this easy way of helping in our local community.

Corners Of Your Field is a partnership opportunity between local churches and Knox Area Rescue Ministries. Corners Of Your Field encourages attendees of our partner churches to be intentional about selecting their gently used household items for donation to KARM Stores. The stores then return a portion of the value of these items in the form of gift cards to your church to help those directly in your care.

How does Corners Of Your Field help my church?

Corners Of Your Field provides a practical way to meet the Biblical mandate of caring for the hurting and homeless, and gives you a plan to do so.

Corners Of Your Field puts resources, beginning with gift cards to KARM Stores, in the hands of every partner church. We recognize you know the needs of your community better than we do and want to equip you to make a difference.

How does this partnership work, practically?

The process is quite simple.

Individuals or families donate their gently used items to KARM Stores.

The KARM Stores employee serving them will ask the name of your church.

Quarterly, your church will receive gift cards to KARM Stores that can be given to anyone who comes to your church in need.

And, donors are still able to take advantage of the tax-deduction with every gift to KARM Stores.

The Outreach Team is working with KARM to set up an on-site donation center one weekend this fall. We will be asking for volunteers from the congregation to assist with this effort. KARM will bring their truck, set up in our parking lot on a Saturday and Sunday, and accept donations of household goods from both the congregation and the local community. The theme in Planet Worship this month is *BIBLE OLYMPICS*. As we eagerly anticipate next month's summer games in Rio de Janeiro, kids will learn about the history and tradition of the Olympic Games. This year's Olympics will feature 28 sporting events. More than 10,500 athletes from 206 nations are expected to take part.

Each week in Planet Worship, kids will learn a new Bible story that demonstrates one of the principles of the Olympic Motto: Faster – Higher – Stronger. Kids will even get to participate in Erin's own Olympic games, win medals, and stand on the Olympic podium!
