There are so many tragic and violent events happening in our country and around the world that we are all suffering from a weariness with regard to the wickedness we constantly hear about in news reports from all over the planet. These tragedies and terrorist attacks can make us feel as though the world is an unhappy and insecure place. We may currently experience both sadness and anxiety about the future; we may even feel that God is distant and has lost control of humanity.

Pastor Stuart's Sunday School Class: Connections



Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

The last few months have been particularly difficult when it comes to disasters. It appears that every time we tune in to the news there is another tragedy unfolding somewhere around us, whether here in the U.S. or abroad. It can be overwhelming. The Outreach Ministry Team has designated a portion of your contributions from the past month to PDA's General Disaster Relief account where the funds can be used where they are needed the most.

Anyone can contribute to PDA at any time and designate a particular account (U.S. flooding, public violence, etc.). Some brochures are available in the narthex or you may give online. Search online for *Presbyterian Disaster Assistance*. Under the menu, you can click 'Disaster Responses' to choose National, International or Specialized. There is a red 'Donate Now' button. Toward the bottom of the main page you may scroll through and click on one of the 'Currently Responding' disasters, and the link will take you to a page that will provide updates on the situation, information on ways to give, act, and pray. Each link will also include the designated PDA disaster response account number for that particular crisis,

for those wanting to submit checks rather than pay by credit card.
