Connections Class in January: The Declaration of Barmen Against Hitler

What would you have done as a congregational member or a pastor in Germany during the 1930s? Would you have followed 95% of the German Church which embraced Hitler as its Führer? Would you have capitulated under Nazi oppression by expressing that Church and Politics should only be mixed in order to make the nation great once more? These things happened in Germany last century when Christian pastors, elders, and members were confronted with a growing evil of ignorance, populism, and fascism.

A minority of pastors under leaders like Martin Niemoller, Karl Barth, and Dietrich Bonhoeffer, formed the Confessing Church in opposition to the National Church’s idolization of Hitler as the country’s savior. In 1934, they boldly declared against this populist movement by writing the *Theological Declaration of Barmen*. It was a courageous act of religious and civil defiance against an inhumane and heinous government. Some of those who signed the declaration lost their lives in Gestapo dungeons and concentration camps. After the war, the Barmen Declaration was embraced by churches around the world and formally included in their historical Book of Confessions. The PC(USA) was one of those churches.

Pastor Stuart will be teaching a 4-week Sunday School series on the Declaration of Barmen throughout the month of January. He will provide the text for each participant to discuss, as well as presenting the background, history, and consequences of this amazing theological stance. The classes will begin on Sunday January 8th at 9:45 AM in the Heritage Room. Everyone is most welcome to attend.

Through the generosity of our wonderful congregation, we ended the year in a great way. Erin is indeed a blessed congregation; we have folks who are giving and caring in so many ways. We are very thankful that we have been able to refinance our debt with a lower interest rate and a lower payment - thank you, Joe Tate! We are thankful that we can begin our new year with a healthy financial profile. AND we are thankful for each of you.

As we start the new year, let's think about our stewardship and make some resolutions around that. The following is from the International Catholic Stewardship Council (with slight modification).

Exercising Stewardship of God’s Gifts in the New Year



January is traditionally the time for New Year’s resolutions. It’s an ideal time to take stock, reassess and recommit to a life lived for and in Jesus Christ. Here are a few suggestions for the important areas of our faith life:

Stewardship of Prayer: Nothing is more important than cultivating a closer, deeper relationship with God. Make a new commitment to a time **each day** to listen to God’s voice.

Stewardship of Family: How often in our busy lives does time with family get neglected? Resolve to find a special time with each family member each week. Make sure that family meals are celebrated frequently. Plan a special family outing once or twice a month, and worship together. Resolve that when your spouse or child speak, you will look at them and truly listen.

Stewardship of Health: Your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit. Without good health, we lack the energy to serve the Lord well. Resolve to make that doctor or dentist appointment. Make one healthy change in your eating habits. Add a few minutes of extra exercise to each day’s routine. **Stewardship of Possessions:** Want less. Live more simply. Do you own your possessions, or do they own you? Challenge yourself to sacrifice something you like but that you know another person needs more than you.

Stewardship of the Church Family: Offer your service to Erin in the New Year. Enrich your church experience by becoming involved.

Stewardship of Money: Take charge of your budget and your checkbook. Reprioritize your financial goals to ensure that the Lord is coming first in the expenditure of your wealth. Plan your spending and don’t spend reactively or impulsively.

Stewardship of Work: Do your best at your chosen profession. Be honest and faithful. Resolve to find a class or other forum that will strengthen your knowledge and expertise. Bring a prayerful attitude to your job.

Stewardship of Mind: Resolve to read something regularly that enhances your faith life. Resolve to learn more about your faith.

Stewardship of Neighbor: Be aware of those around you, whether it be your co-workers, fellow church members, neighbors, restaurant workers or store employees. Everyone needs a smile and Christian kindness.

Stewardship of the Poor: Resolve to interact with the poor in some specific way this year. Resolve to choose a time and place to minister to the poor in some way. Bring them into your prayer life as well.

Stewardship of Talents: Use the talents that God has given you at Church or in the community. Bake, sing, act, paint, photograph, babysit, build, comfort - whatever talent you have, use it to God's glory.

Youth Trip Summer 2017


We are excited to announce that we will be teaming up with the youth group from 2nd Presbyterian to travel to Heifer Ranch in Perryville, Arkansas to participate in their Alternative Break program. The discipleship team considered several options for the 2017 trip and we all concluded this was a great option for our church and feel it will be a fun and valuable experience for our youth.

Most of you are familiar with Heifer International and the work that they do, but if you are not, I encourage you to check out their website at heifer.org. The Alternative Break program focuses on the core components of an introduction to Heifer International, service learning, educational activities and taking action. All of the activities are designed to increase the group's understanding of global hunger and poverty issues.

The trip is a weeklong experience and is open to our high school youth, including rising freshman and graduating seniors. The cost for the Alternative Break program is **\$350** per person, with the church paying **\$200** of that cost. The remaining amount will be fundraised and a parental portion. We will have some additional cost for travel that will be dependent on the number of youth we have participate in the trip.

We will host an informational meeting on **January 8th** at the regular high school group time of **5:45**. The youth leader from 2nd Presbyterian, Christina Gore, will also join us to share her experience of Heifer Ranch when she was a youth. If your

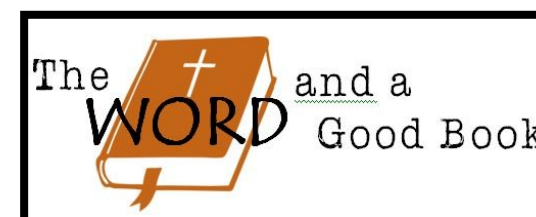

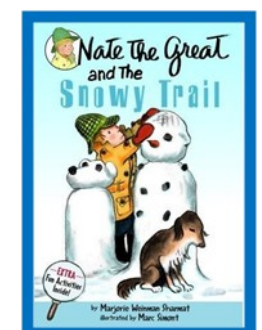
