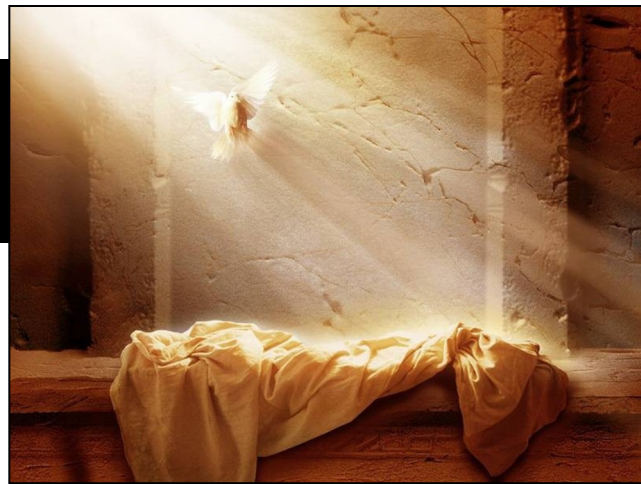
At **Passport to Peru VBS**, kids will discover God’s good gifts for us all!

HOLY WEEK SERVICES AND PROGRAMS

Throughout Holy Week, we will still be holding our regular weekly programs. If there are any changes to those plans, the program leaders will let their participants know.

On Maundy Thursday, April 13th, we will hold our annual Tenebrae Communion service at 6:30PM in the Sanctuary. This is one of the most moving and deeply spiritual worship experiences in the whole Christian year. If you have never attended one of these services, please consider coming out to it on Maundy Thursday. It will have a deep impact on who you are as a follower of Christ.

On Saturday, April 15th, A Time of Reflection. Join us in the Sanctuary sometime between 10AM - 4PM as we reflect on Jesus' last 7 sayings while on the cross. We spend this time preparing our hearts for the true meaning of the celebration to come. You may come and stay, or drop in any time.

On Easter morning, April 16th, we begin our celebrations with a special Sunrise Service at beautiful Tate's School of Discovery on Cedar Bluff. Every year, the Tates open their school grounds for our folks to worship Christ as the sun rises in the East. The campus has a wonderful view of the Smoky Mountains and it is one of the pastor's favorite services in the entire year. We gather at the flagpole, sing Easter hymns, read scripture, and say prayers of thanksgiving. The worship only lasts about fifteen minutes.

This year, sunrise takes place at 7:01AM, so we'll be gathering at about 6:50AM at the school. Everyone is welcome. Tate's School is located at the top of Cedar Bluff, just before it meets Middlebrook Pike.

Then, come to our Annual Brandon Breakfast for Easter, in the Fellowship Hall at 9:30AM. Everyone is welcome to attend and it is always a great opportunity to catch up with old friends and dear families. At 10:15AM, the fun continues with an Easter Egg Hunt for the children, around the church.

Finally, at 11:00AM, we have our beautiful Easter Worship Service which always has some wonderful music and is our happiest celebration in the whole year, as we joyfully sing about Christ's glorious Resurrection. Come and enjoy!

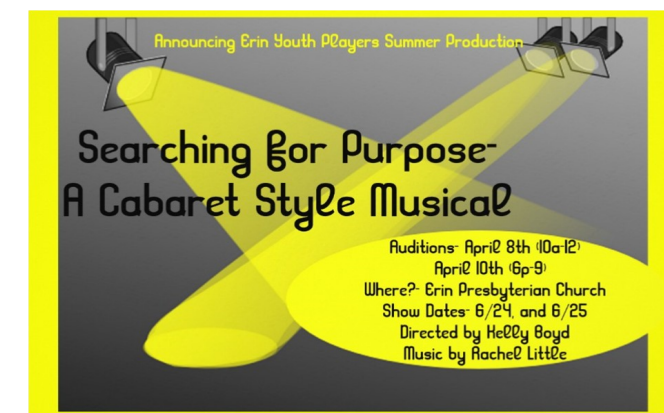
Such is the Kingdom: This group is a girls' show choir for K-5th grade. They have been working hard, and have done several local visits, bringing smiles to our community.
