Dear Friends,

Two events occurred in our nation last month which will continue to deeply affect us for years to come. The first was the horrifying massacre in Parkland where 17 teachers and students were slaughtered by a demented gunman. We were all shocked and traumatized by this callous and cowardly act. The wounds that the families carry in Parkland may never be healed, so it's left to all of us to create a better and safer society for all who live in this beautiful land. How we do that will take a great deal of dialogue and prayer, cooperation and change. Hopefully, we can agree on real solutions to this urgent problem. Our young people are looking to all of us to own this issue; they rely on us to seek and find an enduring answer.

The second event was the death of Dr. Billy Graham. His influence on our faith was immense and his work for the Lord unequaled. He took and preached the Gospel all over the world, affecting and changing the lives of millions of people. I know this to be true because, in 1956, he visited my hometown of Glasgow, Scotland. During his crusade over there, my Aunt Sylvia gave her heart to the Lord and has maintained that faith throughout her life. Indeed, when I was in the hospital after taking an overdose as a teenager, my aunt traveled more than thirty miles to visit with me. Her love and prayers at that time helped me to recover and heal. I guess in a roundabout way, I have Dr. Graham to thank for that precious moment which still remains in my own heart today.

As we approach Easter on April 1st, I hope that we will all focus on what Christ has done for us. It will be wonderful to see all of our families and friends again at the beautiful Easter Sunday worship service. For me, it is the highlight of the whole Christian year and I look forward to praising God with all of the good people at Erin, to share the Gospel, and to proclaim Christ as our Savior and King. In Him alone, those ancient words of David at the top of this message are completely fulfilled:
