TO THE Come to the Table, our all-church theme for 2018-2019, will unite our many groups and programs around a common idea and help us reflect on the ways God invites us to His table.

cred space. As we share a meal, we talk about where we've been and where God may be leading us. We laugh together, share concerns, and pray together—first by thanking God before the meal, and later as we reflect on what was shared and pray for one another. And at God's table we experience His nearness, His kindness, and His love.

The table is a place to remember God's blessings. An ancient prayer of the church says, "Blessed are you, O Lord God, King of the Universe, for you give us food to sustain our lives and make our hearts glad." We echo this when we say Grace before meals and recognize that all we have comes from Him.

Before we invite people to know Jesus or invite them to church, perhaps we should invite them to dinner! This was a distinctive aspect of Jesus's ministry, after all. He had a reputation among the religious establishment for eating and drinking with "notorious sinners." But for Him, and for us, God's table is a place where broken people find connection and belonging to one another and to God.

When Jesus wanted to explain to his disciples what his forthcoming death was about, he did it around the table where they'd gathered for a Passover meal. Using bread and wine as symbols for His body and blood, He told them, and us as well, how He would sacrifice himself to reconcile all people to the Father.

God's table is a symbol of His kingdom on earth, which is open to everyone. Luke 13:29 says, "People will come from the east, west, north, and south and will sit down at the table in the Kingdom of God." God's table offers both spiritual and bodily food, and He invites all people to share in both.

Finally, when we sit down together with other Christians around a table, we get a glimpse of the banquet in the kingdom to come. Old Testament prophets described the day when God would reign over the whole earth by depicting a great feast. Isaiah spoke of a time when Yahweh will prepare "a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine." In that wonderful day when all that is wrong is made right and all that is broken is made whole, there's going to be one extravagant meal!

#### Mission at Massanetta

On June 3rd, our high school students traveled to Massanetta Springs Camp in Harrisonburg, Virginia to participate in the Mission at Massanetta experience. Each day there, they worked with a different area mission.

Our youth worked with Project Grows, Renewing Homes of Greater Augusta County, Equipping the Saints, and the Sunnyside Retirement Community during their time at Massanetta. They particularly enjoyed working with Project Grows and Renewing Homes.

Project Grows mission is to grow a vibrant, healthy, and sustainable generation of young farmers and community builders through food production, food access, and food education. Our youth assisted them in harvesting, sorting, and washing salad greens, weeding green onions, and harvesting garlic and nasturtiums.

While working with Renewing Homes of Greater Augusta County, Konnor, Keegan, and Harter built an accessibility ramp with some assistance from Justin Bornhoeft, Carolyn and Katie rewired several switches and sockets, Chloe and Anna removed damaged siding, and Colton and Hayden repaired a rotted bathroom floor. The mission of Renewing Homes is to accomplish, at no cost to the homeowner, critical home repairs and modifications for elderly, disadvantaged and disabled homeowners of Staunton, Waynesboro and Augusta County so that they can live in their own home with dignity in a safe, warm, dry and accessible environment. Our young people worked really hard at each of the projects and did a fantastic job all week.

There was also time for some fun, and the youth were able to enjoy ziplining and a campfire with s'mores at the camp, as well as a trip in to town for ice cream! Thank you to everyone who supported the trip financially and with your prayers!
