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Dear Friends,

Just over 140 years ago, God planted a little church in the Bearden community which became known as Erin Presbyterian. Most of the first families were Scots-Irish, who had moved into the area just as the railways and new industries were beginning to develop in this part of East Tennessee. The policy of Reconstruction after the Civil War had come to an end, so people believed they were part of a new dream and at the dawn of a New Age. Their hopes were high, so they settled here to build their homes, their community, and their church. It must have been a wonderful time after so much pain and hardship which the war had caused. Those first members of Erin were driven by their aspirations and ambitions, as well as their faith and fellowship with one another. God called them to be a congregation, a holy group of people who supported one another lovingly and who praised God regularly.

Almost a century and a half later, we are still that 'wee church' at the heart of who we are and whatever we set out to do. The mission that Christ established in the 19<sup>th</sup> century continues now in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The little town of Bearden is now a suburb of Knoxville, but the original community spirit can still be experienced, especially in our church. People have a great need to both belong and be accepted, no matter who they are, what they've done, or where they reside. The ways of doing ministry may have changed over the decades, but the mission is still the same: *to lead people to Christ and embrace them with His gracious love.* 

In this Annual Report, you will read and discover what we've been doing over the last year to fulfill our mission. You'll come across pages about ministries, projects, and people that enable us to effectively carry on the calling Christ initially gave our congregation in 1877. I hope you will be delighted to see what's being done and will continue to support and help our congregation make an impact in the Bearden community. Your prayers and commitment, as well as your resources and gifts, ensure that God's work goes on in ways that the First families at Erin could only hope would happen. If we have the same faith and focus, the dream that began way back then will continue beyond this century and into the next.

May God bless all of your own hopes and dreams by making your plans succeed.

Some are long time members of the congregation and some are relatively new – all bring unique ideas and perspectives to our discussions and, with God's help, collectively discern what we mutually believe to be the most prudent distribution of funds from month to month from a percentage of the congregation's offerings while remaining within our allotted budget. This diversity within the team also allows for variety in hands-on mission opportunities we are able to offer the congregation because of the many sources of ideas and connections within the community.

#### DISCIPLESHIP Anna McKay,

Mission: To make true disciples of our members, becoming more Christ-like as we grow in faith.

The Discipleship Team: Anna McKay (E), Cathy Van Ostrand (E), Kim Jaynes (E), Joy Bornhoeft, Farrah Linkous, Lynne Jones and Joe Jaynes.

The Discipleship Team is responsible for the Nursery, Planet Worship, Pioneer Club, Sunday School for all ages, Vacation Bible School, Family Retreat, Rally Day and Middle School/High School Youth programs at Erin. The team meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Heritage Room. Everyone interested in contributing to the planning and leadership of any of these programs is welcome to join the team.

Discipleship's theme for 2017/18 was **God's Work, Our Hands.** We sought to grow as our Lord's disciples by putting our faith and learning into action.

The team's most significant accomplishments for the past year included:

• Sunday School programs for all ages: Our Sunday School classes follow the school year (Aug-May) on Sunday mornings from 9:30 – 10:30. Children attend classes based on age/grade. Adults may choose from 3 classes:

**The Hard Sayings class led by John House:** From the beginning of His earthly ministry to the present day, Jesus has challenged us to look at our world differently. His teachings require us to do the counterintuitive. He requires us to do hard things. Often times, religious teaching glosses over, or ignores, some of the most challenging aspects of what it means to practice Christianity, to be a disciple of Jesus. The Hard Sayings Class attempts to focus on those very things that are, in fact, hard. Hard to look at, hard to understand, hard to apply.

This past year the class studied *Not in God's Name: Confronting Religious Violence* by Jonathan Sacks. An internationally recognized Rabbi and scholar, Sacks argues that religiously inspired violence has as its source the misreading of biblical texts at the heart of all three Abrahamic faiths. He offers a radical reinterpretation of many of the Bible's seminal stories of sibling rivalry such as Cain and Abel, Isaac and Ishmael, Jacob and Esau, etc. If religion is perceived as being part of the problem then it must also form part of the solution.

**Rev. Stuart's Connections class:** Pastor Stuart continued teaching his Connections Class throughout the year. Each month a different topic was presented and discussed. This year included classes about Gifts of the Spirit, the Five Pillars of Islam, Women in the Bible, and a look at the Book of Revelation. One of the highlights of the year took place when Sabrina Siddiqui of the Islamic Tayside Seminary talked to a combined group of all the Sunday School classes about being an American Muslim. Sabrina gave a terrific presentation which created a lot of thought-provoking insights into another faith. The classes are held in the Heritage Room, next to the church parlor, from 9:45 AM to 10:30 AM. The Connections class will resume in the fall and everyone is welcome to attend.

**The JavaScripture class led by Kim and Joe Jaynes:** began with a study titled *SERVING LESSONS: Putting God and Others First.* As our Discipleship theme, **God's Work – Our Hands** implies, we are called to be actively involved in carrying out God's will here on earth. In a "me-first" world, followers of Christ are called to be servants. That's a tall order, and it's not just another item to add to our list of Christian duties and fit in our busy schedules. It's not optional. The Bible verse we chose as the basis for our theme says, *Let us not love with words or speech, but with actions and in truth* (I John 3:18).

#### DISCIPLESHIP Continued

Last winter we used the DVD series *Modern Parables* to explore Jesus' well-known parables through high-quality short films. Each story is set in the present day, updated but closely paralleling the context and meaning Jesus' original hearers would have experienced. In one, a high schooler watches both his father – a successful doctor and church deacon – and his youth leader pass by an unconscious elderly man slumped on the sidewalk, and then sees a middle-Eastern cab driver put the man in his cab, take him to the emergency room, and return to pick him up the next day. Seeing the parables in a fresh light had a profound impact on our understanding of Jesus's teaching.

Returning to our year-long theme in the spring, we studied the book *Don't Waste Your Life* by John Piper. He writes, "I will tell you how to waste your life. The February 1998 Reader's Digest tells of a couple who retired from their jobs five years ago when he was 59 and she was 51. Now they live in Florida, where they cruise on their 30-foot sailboat and collect shells. Picture them before Christ at the great day of judgment: 'Look, Lord. See my shells.' That is a tragedy, Piper says. God created us to live with a single passion: to joyfully display his supreme excellence in all spheres of life. Most people live without a passion for God, caught up in a trivial life that counts for nothing. Instead, God calls us to pray and think and dream and plan and work not to be made much of, but to make much of him in every part of our lives.

- Planet Worship (Sunday mornings) and Pioneer Club (Wednesday evenings) are led by Joy Bornhoeft our most creative Director of Family Ministries. The programs vary but each provides an active way for children 4 years old through 5<sup>th</sup> grade to grow in their faith.
- Vacation Bible School: Our theme this year was "Game On! Gearing up for life's game" Held at Erin in June it was open to children ages 3 10.
- Youth Programs: Held on Sunday evenings, our youth programs are energetically led by Farrah Linkous our Youth Director. Building on our theme of "God's Work; Our Hands" the year focused on service projects and was highlighted by a mission focused youth trip to Massanetta Springs, Virginia.
- Church Family Retreat: The annual retreat was held at the John Knox Center in August. Over 30 adults came to hear and learn from Andy Morgan, campus minister with the University of Tennessee's UKirk House. In the afternoon the adults along with 10 children/youth enjoyed fishing, canoeing, tubing and swimming on beautiful Watt's Bar Lake.

Looking forward our Discipleship theme for 2018/19 is **Come to the Table**. "And they will come from east and west and from north and south, and will recline at the table in the kingdom of God." Luke 13:29. Everyone is welcome at God's table!

We encourage you to come to **Rally Day on Sunday morning, August 12<sup>th</sup>**. Enjoy some great food and fellowship and learn about the upcoming Sunday School classes. You will also learn about this year's incentive prize for regular attendance!

We also invite you to attend our **Church Family Retreat at John Knox Center on August 24th-25th**. Back by popular demand will be Andy Morgan, campus minister for UKirk at The University of Tennessee. Thank you for your support of all of the Discipleship programs at Erin. Please invite family, friends and co-workers to any of our activities. All are welcome at God's table!

#### FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR Joy Bornhoeft

# As the Family Ministries Director, I plan and coordinate all of Erin's Christian education programs for children, birth through 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

This past year, Erin offered three **Children's Sunday School** classes: a 2 & 3 year old class, Younger Elementary (4 years old –  $1^{st}$  Grade), and Older Elementary ( $2^{nd} - 5^{th}$  Grade) classes. Eleven children regularly attended Sunday School throughout the year. All three classes used the PCUSA published curriculum.

**Planet Worship**, our weekly Children's Church ministry, is geared for kids 4 years old  $-4^{th}$  grade. This program teaches our children the fundamentals of why and how we worship as Christians and Presbyterians. A faithful team of 12 volunteers led this program for some 20 children this year.

This year, Planet Worship lessons included: a multi-part series, *Bible Stories from the Mountaintop*; exploration of the theme *God's Work* ~ *Our Hands* and related artwork projects; worship themed lessons on the order of worship, prayer, offering, the Sacraments, the Reformation, and liturgical seasons; Advent themes of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love; Epiphany Around the World; Pentecost; and Trinity Sunday. During Lent, and throughout the remainder of the year, lessons followed the lectionary gospel readings using Storypath, a resource of Union Presbyterian Seminary. These lessons used children's books to engage the kids in the same scripture readings used in adult worship.

The children selected the *Presbyterian Disaster Assistance* "Gifts of the Heart Hygiene Kits" as their offering project. Kids donated a variety of hygiene items and then packed 24 kits during Planet Worship on the first Sunday of Advent.

**Pioneer Club** is our Wednesday Night Program that meets weekly throughout the school year. I had the pleasure of personally leading this program for 14 children, ages 4 years old –  $5^{th}$  Grade. This year's theme was *Pioneer Rangers* and explored our wonderful world of amazing animals. Each week we studied a new animal through books, crafts, games, and science fun.

In September, four of our 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Graders attended the **3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Pre-Teen Retreat at the John Knox Center** with 40 kids from different churches throughout our Presbytery. During the overnight retreat, preteens studied the Parable of the Sower and learned how to explore God's Word with their whole bodies – through meditation and yoga techniques, walking the prayer labyrinth, and art. Kids also enjoyed the many outdoor activities that John Knox offers.

In early February, I was blessed to attend the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators (APCE) Annual Event in Louisville, KY. The 3-day conference was both very educational and renewing. The theme was *Deep and Wide: Boundless Hospitality*. I attended keynote sessions, worship, and workshops on Reformed resources for children's ministry, children and worship, nurturing public faith, and all-church thematic planning.

In June, we held our annual **Vacation Bible School** with a sports theme *Game On!*. Twenty-five children (ages 4 years through 5<sup>th</sup> grade) and 11 youth helpers attended the 4-day event, led by a team of 10 adult volunteers. The children collected over \$176 for the VBS mission project. The money was donated to World Vision to gift 44 soccer balls to children in need throughout the world.

#### NURSERY DIRECTOR Lynne Jones

#### It has been a wonderful year for us in the nursery!

Sara and I have been blessed with taking care of the sweetest children! We typically have from one to five children in the nursery every Sunday during the worship service. Since we have had only one infant attending during the Sunday School hour, we have not had "lessons" at that time.

The children enjoy listening to stories, playing with cars, working on puzzles, "cooking", building, watching videos, and most importantly eating snacks!

We have had several families donate toys and books to the nursery as well. Our families have been very supportive. We pray that we are able to provide a positive experience for our little ones...that they may know the love of Christ!

**Christmas Potluck:** The Congregation met right after church for a Potluck lunch on December 3, 2017.

**Christmas Caroling:** December 17, 2017 we visited two nursing homes and several of our elderly members, then returned to the church for fellowship and refreshments.

**Brandon Breakfast:** Served breakfast for a little over one hundred people on Easter Sunday (April 1, 2018). This was followed by an Easter egg hunt for the younger children.

**Red, White and Blue Potluck:** In celebration of July 4th we had a potluck lunch right after church on July 2, 2017.

**Easter Lilies and Poinsettias:** We provided Easter lilies and poinsettias for our members who wish to purchase them as gifts or dedications to loved ones.

Bridal and Baby Showers: We provide refreshments and decorations for these occasions as requested.

**We provide congregational care:** This involves sending greeting cards to members who are ill or homebound, or in need of any kind of attention or care. We also provide meals in case of illness or a death in the family.

#### STEWARDSHIP Neill Murphy, Convener

#### The Stewardship Committee is in charge of utilizing the Church's resources of Time, Talents and Money.

The 2017-2018 Stewardship Team is comprised of Convener Neill Murphy, Elder John House (2018-2019 Convener), Elder Craig Strand, Pastor John Stuart, and Bookkeeper Kim Pennington.

The primary responsibility of the Committee is oversight of Erin's Budgets. Monitoring to make sure we have the funds to do The Lord's Work.

We met monthly to review the 2017-2018 Budget, questioning the other Committees if they appeared to have extraordinary expenditures. When Property had some Capital repairs requests, we worked with them to find the appropriate funds to fill the need.

We pay particular attention to our Savings Account Balance at Home Federal. This account contains our daily operating funds. Recent Conveners have tried to maintain a three month cushion of funds to operate the Church. I am pleased to report that due to your generous gifts, we have maintained adequate funding and our targeted cushion.

The Stewardship Committee makes submissions regularly to Erin's Newsletters. This year, attention was given to last year's Federal Income Tax reform legislation, and some possible effects on our Congregants.

Our Stewardship Campaign for 2018 was in keeping with the Church's theme for the year: "God's Work, Our Hands." Our Campaign was "Our Plans in God's Hands", based on Jeremiah 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to hinder you, plans to give you hope and a future." Our 4 week individual topics were: God Knows (HIS plans for us), God Grows (and prosper us), God Bestows (a new hope for us), God Goes (out ahead of us)

Pastor Stuart performed Sermons in line with the theme and individual topics. Individual Speakers from the Church presented their take on their week's topic. Many thanks to all who contributed to the Campaign. Our Pledges increased by about \$15,000 over the previous year!!

The Stewardship Team continued the monthly practice of reminding the Congregation to help us "Lower the Debt". The proceeds from this campaign alone - in addition to pledged giving to the Capital Account - was in excess of one month's Mortgage Payment!

We also wish to thank our Bookkeeper, Kim Pennington for her continued dedicated service to the Church. Kim does a fantastic job of keeping our Accounts and information current.

We are proceeding with processing the 2018-2019 Annual Church Budget. Our goal is to receive all of the other Committee's budgets this month and present the combined Budget to the Congregation in July.

As we embark on the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year beginning July 1, please keep the Church in your thoughts and Prayers, to ask The Lord for his continued blessing of Erin Presbyterian Church.
