1 John 4:18a "There is no fear in love." (NIV)

Dear Friends,

Fear is the exact opposite of faith. It gnaws away at our confidence and causes us to become insecure. It separates us from the love of God and imprisons us in a cage of anxiety which diminishes our capacity to live lovingly. Fear makes us believe in things that do not exist and manipulates our thoughts. Those who use fear to persuade us, have only one thing in mind: to control our lives and keep us captive to their ambitions.

When FDR said that 'the only thing we have to fear is fear itself,' he was reminding our people of the false security and fake charms that fear seductively offers. At a crucial time in American history, President Roosevelt knew that in order for the nation to survive the Great Depression, the people had to combine their strength and resources, as well as their resolve and determination, in order to overcome those hard and anxious times. Politically, FDR knew that he could present and initiate many new programs and policies to help the economy, but without the resolute spirit of the people and their steadfast support, their greatest enemy – FEAR – would not be overcome. In many ways, his call to confront the fear of his day was a perfect seeding ground for the greater unity that would be needed when the United States became involved in World War 2.

Today, we live in fearful and unstable times. Our people are divided and our nation is splintering in many different ways. People are insecure about the future and are succumbing to their anxieties. The role of the Church is to employ the heavenly gift of faith in order to counter the hellish curse of fear. In the face of hatred and despair, we offer hope and love. To face off darkness and falsehood, we present truth and light. To counter anxiety and alarm, we bring peace and assurance. In other words, *the only thing we have to diminish fear is faith itself.*

At Erin Church, we encourage all sorts of people to come to the table of God's love. We aim to share that love by living out our vision: *Unified in Christ, we actively seek to create harmony in a diverse community through compassion, mutual respect, and love.*

If ever there was a time to fulfill this wonderful vision, that time is now.

A NOTE FROM STEWARDSHIP

Last month I explained how it was that we ended up with a debt of half a million dollars after we completed the renovations to the church. I explained how it was that we have worked to pay that off, and had it down to about \$444,000, but that we had not been bringing in enough money each month to fully cover the payment. I explained that within a year we were going to have a financial crisis if we could not get commitments to cover that \$3000 monthly payment.

The response to my request was immediate and positive. People pledged to give the additional money we needed and we easily made our next payment. We also had some people pledge to bolster the reserve fund, in case we did not meet our monthly payment one month and needed to fall back on our buffer. All this is pretty good news, and I'm pleased to be able to share it with you.

Knowing the people of Erin, none of that surprised me. But then something happened that did surprise me, and I could not wait to share it with you all. We received an anonymous gift that retired the remaining debt. We do not have any debt remaining from our building renovations. That's right. Erin is debt free.

I cried when I got the news, and even now I feel a relief like there has been a weight lifted.

I would like to express appreciation for all of you. For those of you who pledged and paid the initial \$1million. For those of you who faithfully paid to work down the balance. For those of you who pledged to step up your giving to keep Erin fiscally healthy and keep us out of trouble. And those of you who so generously gave to eliminate the debt for good. You have all made a difference. And what a difference.

Before we conducted the capital campaign, before we did the renovations to the church, we had a fund called the Property Fund. There are always things that break, that leak, that need repairs, just like you encounter at home. Those expenses are challenging because they fall outside the budget. That is the case at Erin as well. The Property Fund was what carried us through those challenges.

When we did do the Building Campaign, we merged the funds from the Property Fund with the Building Fund. We have not had a Property Fund since that time. When something did need repair or replaced, like an AC unit, we took the money from what remained of the money we had for the capital campaign. That buffer I told you was nearly diminished.

We cannot do that now, and so we are going to need to reestablish the Property Fund. I'm asking that those of you who have been paying towards retiring the debt prayerfully consider continuing to give what you can, directing it towards the Property Fund. If we can continue to put \$3000 a month into that fund for 6 months, that would give us \$18,000 in a fund to allow us to meet unexpected financial demands related to the property. Cynthia and I are going to continue to pay what we have been for the next 6 months. I hope many of you will do the same.

Please join me in giving God thanks. Thanks for so richly blessing us. Thanks for having enabled all that we set out to do to improve this church building, for our use now and for the use of generations to come. Thanks for calling all who gave of their time and resources to complete the task you set before us. Thanks that we are able to look at the task and call it complete. Thanks that the future of Erin looks strong.

And again, thanks to all of you as well.


MIDDLE SCHOOL RETREAT


