

Whether you're a musician, actor, singer, or writer, or just have ideas for enhancing the way we worship at Erin, we need you!

#### HOPING TO SPEND MORE TIME WITH THE LORD? **CHECK OUT THE RESOURCES IN OUR LIBRARY**

If one of your New Year's resolutions is to spend more time with God, the Erin library's selection of devotional books can get you started. Some use a devotion-a-day format, **January 1** like The 5-Minute Devotional for Women by Jan Silvious. Charles Swindoll's Come Before Winter is organized by seasons—not just winter, spring, summer, and fall, but seasons of the spirit—hard times, seasons for building faith, and periods of contentment and joy. Other books offer short selections you can read and think about any time. Many of our resources are classics, such as collections from the popular Our Daily Bread booklets, A Testament of Devotion by Quaker teacher Thomas Kelly, the Chicken Soup for the Soul series, and popular authors including Billy Graham, Max Lucado, and Madeline L'Engle. Newer authors are also represented. Brian McLaren's We Make the Road by Walking is a yearlong study with readings and questions to ponder each week of the liturgical year, and Anne Lamott's multiple collections of short essays, including Help, Thanks, Wow—The Three Essential Prayers, offer a fresh perspective on our relationship with God. You'll see these and other books on display in the library throughout January, so stop by and choose one to start off your new year by deepening your relationship with God.
