It's vacation season! And while we Erin folks may be traveling to see family or enjoying a week at the beach, we may also be entertaining guests in our homes and seeing visitors in our midst on Sunday morning. Many will return to distant places and home churches, but others may be searching for a church family here in Knoxville. Either way, we are called to practice Christian hospitality to strangers in our midst. How good are we at doing this?

Bill Tenney-Brittian is an expert in church hospitality, and readily concedes that no church is perfect in every aspect. While Erin does a great job at most aspects of hospitality, we can certainly benefit from reviewing what Tenney calls the "Seven Deadly Sins of Church Hospitality." Here they are in no particular order:

- 1. Ignoring guests! Yes, most guests don't want to be "killed with kindness," but smiles and warm handshakes are mandatory! No excuses!
- 2. Making a big public introduction without quests' express permission! This is the other extreme. What people most fear when they visit a church is being embarrassed or made intentionally welcomes guests and helps them BELONG, to feel uncomfortable! They will never come back!

- 3. Hiding the restrooms. HUGE MISTAKE! (Refer back to "embarrassment.")
- 4. Making parking inaccessible and without direction for guests, and/or not attending to wet or slippery sidewalks.
- 5. Hiding the front door of the church! How are guests to know that what appears to be the "front door" may no longer access the sanctuary!
- 6. Expecting guests to immediately join and serve on committees. Oh my! Desperation is never a selling point! Visitors need time to become returning visitors, then participants, then participating members.
- 7. Having no active program of discipleship for returning visitors and inquirers. How will the church lovingly introduce new folks to the ministry and mission of the church? How will the church disciple those who are hearing the gospel for the first time?

This last item is at the very heart of Christian hospitality and a cornerstone of our new Vision at Erin Church. Let's work together to become a church that BECOME, and go BEYOND.

# **RESPONSE TO HATE SPEECH**

### Erin's Response to Knoxville Pastor's Hate Speech

As Adopted by the Session of Erin Presbyterian Church on 6/26/2019

Recently, several local and national news outlets reported on a sermon delivered by a local pastor. The sermon condemned members of the LGBTQ+ community and advocated for their arrest, trial and death in the name of God. As a body of Christian believers, we feel strongly that it is our duty to make known the following:

We are deeply grieved by all hate speech and the pain it causes to the LGBTQ+ community.

We are deeply grieved by this misrepresentation of Christianity and the shadow it casts on all Christians.

We unequivocally believe the message of Jesus Christ is love and acceptance of one another.

We do not share the belief that church and government should be one.

The Vision of Erin Presbyterian Church—"Unified in Christ, we actively seek to create harmony in a diverse community through compassion, mutual respect, and love"—is something we at Erin take seriously and try to live individually and corporately every day. One of the core values that we affirm and strongly believe is that God loves all people equally and calls us to love all people equally and to demonstrate our love through attention to their holistic needs. Our doors are open to all who truly seek a relationship with God and want to join with us in this spiritual journey that is Christianity.

We offer our prayers, compassion, and love to the LGBTQ+ community and all of those hurt by this sermon and all hate speech. Although we strongly condemn hatred and disagree with those who advocate it, we continue to pray for them as well.


