Philippians 4:6 *“Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.” (ESV)*

We live in anxious times. Many people worry about the future, especially for their children and grandchildren. Ever since this century began, there appears to be a lot of turbulence and unrest across the world. Almost every week, some sort of tragedy or disaster takes place which ends up being continuously displayed on our TV screens, computer monitors, and cellphones. As we repeatedly see and read about these sad situations, we begin to lose our confidence in what is yet to come. We retreat into our shells in order to find safety; we isolate ourselves in the hope of maintaining our inner peace.

When Paul was writing his letter to the young church in Philippi, the times were very similar to our own. The Roman empire was continually at war; plagues and famine were constantly present, and natural disasters like volcanic eruptions or earthquakes often took place with disastrous results. Christians were also being persecuted, so Paul’s words were meant to both comfort and fortify his fellow-believers. He had spent much of his ministry in Philippi, so he knew most of the congregation. He wanted them to experience God’s peace, so he wrote them compassionately and faithfully.

For Paul, prayer was the key to obtaining peace. Talking to God about personal problems, individual issues, or whelming worries was the most effective way to find real solutions to all of the turmoil. If God’s people transformed their worries into prayers, then they would receive strength to endure and the guidance to overcome their dilemmas. Paul knew this to be true because he had personally been through many serious and dangerous situations which had been turbulent and even life-threatening.

Paul’s words are still applicable in our own lives today. We may be almost twenty centuries away from his time, but we are human beings who still experience the same vulnerability and anxiety that the Philippians once felt. This means that Paul’s advice is just as relevant now as it was way back then: we need to really come to God in prayer to seek His guidance and ask for His help. And when we genuinely do this, the results may still be the same, which Paul also wrote about in the following verse:

Philippians 4:7 *“And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” (ESV)*

May you also find God’s much-needed peace for you and all your loved ones.

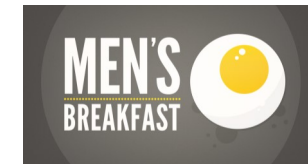
There will be no BreadBreakers this month.

Pre-Teen Retreat

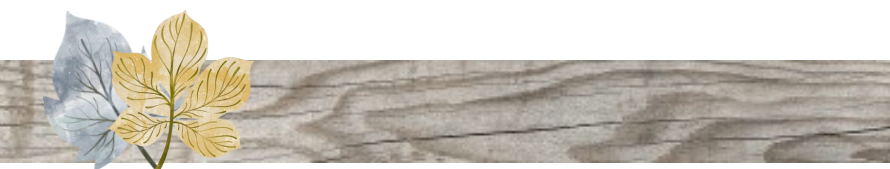

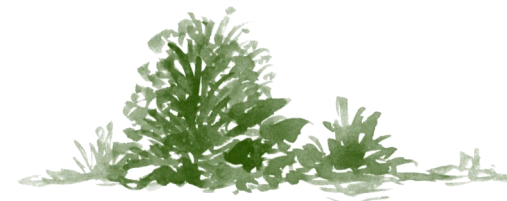
