

John Lennon & Me is set in a residence house for seriously ill young people attached to a hospital in Nashville. The playwright uses comedy and teenage language to show how young people learn to cope with serious illness and life altering circumstances. The play unfolds from the viewpoint of a teenage girl, Star, who wants to be an actress and is the ultimate Beatles fan. However, she is also battling cystic fibrosis, an inherited disease that assures a young death. She spends most of her time in the hospital where her active imagination, stories and interactions with other teenage patients

help her cope with the reality that she will never have a "normal" life. This is a powerful, touching, and yet uproarious play about living life to the fullest, the power of friendship, and how understanding each other can ultimately help us understand ourselves. It uses comedy to explore complicated emotional issues in a responsible and respectful way. The playwright dedicates the play to "all the people who know what it feels like to be on the outside looking in."

STEWARDSHIP

As summer approaches, so does Budget Time.

A financial budget is comprised of two sets of predictions. One predicts how much money will be coming in and the other how much money will be going out. Income and expenses. Both predictions are educated guesses. We always have some decisions to make along the way, decisions that influence both income and expenses, but a budget is a starting point towards being able to know what to anticipate.

Developing a budget for an organization is more challenging than developing one for our personal finances because there are always many more factors on both sides of the equation. It is especially challenging to develop a budget for a volunteer organization like a church.

There are a some factors there that make predictions even harder, especially on the income side. Churches rely on member giving for income. That giving ranges from literally nothing to a significant part of a family's income. So, giving depends not only how much money does each family have, but what percentage of what they have do they give to church. Both of those factors can vary a great deal from family to family.

Churches ask their members to pledge so that it is possible to have some idea what to expect for income, and many families do. Some do not, but they give anyway. Sometimes people do pledge but do not give as much as they pledge. Others do not pledge or give.

Stewardship is left to make an educated guess, based on pledges and historical trends, of how much money is likely

to come in for the year. Because not everyone pledges and because we have new members who were not here when it was time to do budgets, there is always some giving above what was pledged. It's really hard to guess how much that will be, however.

Usually, we do pretty well. Last year we were off. Historical trends did not hold up and we imagined we would have more income than we actually had. We were off about 10%, in fact.

Ten percent is not a lot, really. Ten percent of \$40 is only \$4. Ten percent of \$250 is only \$25. But those ten-percents can add up if you have a lot of them. Ten percent of our budget is a lot.

What would be great, and would help immensely, would be if every member would give the church a raise. A 10% raise. If you already give \$50 a week, just make it \$55. If you give \$150 a week, round it up to \$165. Whatever your contribution, if you can bump it up just 10%, we are home free.

We are in a time of transition, and we have every reason to see this as a time of rejuvenation and renewal. We do not want to impede that by having to cut programs or limit what the church can do.

We know Erin is important to you. Please be generous and help keep her in good financial health. Thanks!

WHAT ARE OUR STRATEGIES?

Session developed two strategies to respond to the critical external and internal issues facing Erin church. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, our strategies for attending to the future of Erin Church over the next 3 to 5 years:

STRATEGY 1: Instilling in Erin's members & friends, as seekers together, a true understanding of and subsequent active commitment to what it means to be and to live as Christ's disciple.

STRATEGY 2: Sharing with the community the ministries that God has called Erin to as a body of believers & living as disciples of Christ in all aspects of our individual & diverse lives so that others see Jesus in us.

WHY ARE THEY NECESSARY?

Why is developing strategies necessary? Why can't we just continue doing what we have always done? With mainline Protestant churches rapidly losing members and the percentage of people attending most churches declining yearly, especially among Gen Xers and Millennials, change is necessary for our church to maintain relevancy, growth, and long-term sustainability. What used to work to attract, retain and grow members into mature Christians, engaged in service in the church

members of Erin need just look around on a Sunday morning to realize we, too, are being impacted by the current trends. Changing in positive ways as the environment changes is a common characteristic of all healthy, living things. Churches, like all organizations, are living entities, made up of the people who nourish and give them life. Positive change comes from challenging the status quo and tradition, from men and women having the courage to examine how well the organization is adapting and to make the necessary changes for it to thrive. Though not always comfortable, your Session and Staff demonstrated such courage in our work to develop strategies. We ask that all Erin members demonstrate this same courage and join us in implementing these strategies by committing to *Belong, Become, and go Beyond*. Coming in June: We'll share the exciting changes scheduled to launch in August that will enable us to implement our strategies and realize our vision!!

Looking for something to do out of the heat with your family? Come and join us for Bingo night on July 24. More news on that to come!


