PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

Reader: God of Wisdom, silence our busy minds and critical spirits. Allow the text to speak the message each one most needs to hear. Amen.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Romans 12:3-9, 15-18

3 Because of the grace that God gave me, I can say to each one of you: don't think of yourself more highly than you ought to think. Instead, be reasonable since God has measured out a portion of faith to each one of you.

4-5 We have many parts in one body, but the parts don't all have the same function. In the same way, though there are many of us, we are one body in Christ, and individually we belong to each other.

6-7 We have different gifts that are consistent with God's grace that has been given to us. If your gift is prophecy, you should prophesy in proportion to your faith. If your gift is service, devote yourself to serving. If your gift is teaching, devote yourself to teaching.

8 If your gift is encouragement, devote yourself to encouraging. The one giving should do it with no strings attached. The leader should lead with passion. The one showing mercy should be cheerful.

9 Love should be shown without pretending. Hate evil, and hold on to what is good.

15 Be happy with those who are happy, and cry with those who are crying.

16 Consider everyone as equal, and don't think that you're better than anyone else. Instead, associate with people who have no status. Don't think

that you're so smart.

17 Don't pay back anyone for their evil actions with evil actions, but show respect for what everyone else believes is good.

18 If possible, to the best of your ability, live at peace with all people.

All: This is the Word of the Lord. Amen.

1 Look at how good and pleasing it is when families live together as one!

2 It is like expensive oil poured over the head, running down onto the beard - Aaron's beard! - which extended over the collar of his robes.

3 It is like the dew on Mount Hermon streaming down onto the mountains of Zion,
