AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Our Affirmation of Faith this Sunday comes from "The Confession of Belhar" which was written in Apartheid-era South Africa. It affirms that God calls people from across the entire human family to be united under Christ, and that racial separation has no place within the Church. It calls for unity, reconciliation, and justice as expressions of holiness and transformation in Christ's image.

Excerpt from the Confession of Belhar

Pastor: We believe in the triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, who gathers, protects and cares for the church through Word and Spirit.

People: We believe in one holy, universal Christian church, the communion of saints called from the entire human family.

Pastor: We believe that unity is both a gift and an obligation for the church of Jesus Christ.

People: Through the working of God's Spirit, unity is a binding force.

Pastor: Unity is also simultaneously a reality which must be earnestly pursued and sought.

People: We believe that this unity can be established only in freedom and not under constraint.

Pastor: The variety of spiritual gifts, opportunities, backgrounds, convictions, as well as the various languages and cultures, are by virtue of the reconciliation in Christ, opportunities for mutual service and enrichment within the one visible people of God.

All: Jesus is Lord. To the one and only God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be the honor and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
